PROSPECTUS

GENERAL INFORMATION

St. Teresa's English Medium School, Barpeta is a co-educational institute, run by the Board of Trustees of St. Teresa's Educational Trust, meant for all irrespective of caste or community.

The primary aim of this institution is to impart sound formation - religious, moral, psychological, social, intellectual and physical. Ample opportunities are provided to the students through various activities such as house system, clubs, competitions, work experience, co-curricular activities, computer education as well as building leadership quality. Special attention is given to ensure a high standard of morality, discipline and character development in the school.

The school enjoys the co-operation of parents/guardians, the teaching staff and the people of the locality in the realization of its noble ideals.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR THE ADMISSION OF STUDENTS

1. Photo Copy of the Birth Certificate of the Student.
2. Three Passport size photographs of the Student.
3. Photo Copy of the Aadhar Card of Student, Father and Mother.
4. The Presence of the child and his / her parents / guardian at the time of Admission.
5. Transfer Certificate from the previous school.
(Class II onwards)
6. Progress Report from the previous school.
(Class II onwards)
7. Permanent Education Number (PEN) from the previous school.
(Class II onwards)

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. In order to acquire greater proficiency in the English language, students are expected to speak English on the School premises.
2. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience, conduct injurious to the moral tone of the school, etc., shall justify the dismissal of a student from the school, at any time of the year.
3. Acts of indiscipline, insubordination, interference in the administration of the school, disrespect to any region, religion or community will not be tolerated and may cause expulsion of a student from the school.
4. Students are responsible for the safe custody of their books and other belongings. Ornaments and jewellery of any kind are not allowed in the school.
5. Students should not keep money, costly articles, etc. with them. The school will not take any responsibility in the case of any loss or damage.

6. QUARTERLY FEE DUE DATES :

- 1st QUARTERLY on or before : 15th May, 2026.
- 2nd QUARTERLY on or before : 15th August, 2026.
- 3rd QUARTERLY on or before : 15th November, 2026.
- 4th QUARTERLY Nursery to IX on or before : 15th February, 2027.

Note : Class - X Students must pay the 4th quarterly fee before collecting the HSLC admit card.

A late fee of Rs. 100/- per month, per quarterly will be charged after the due date.

7. If any student leaves the school in the middle of the academic year then he/she will have to bear the fees of the remaining months also.
8. Students are strictly forbidden to introduce objectionable literature in the school. Parcels and letters addressed to the students are subject to inspection.
9. Any damage done to the school property must be made good by the students concerned.
10. The school can't be held responsible for accident, minor or serious, to the students during the stay in the school, while commuting or while taking part in sports, co-curricular activities, etc. within or outside the school premises.
11. Stealing, forging signature and adoption of unfair means in exams are serious faults and those found guilty of the same are liable to be expelled even if it takes place off the school premises.
12. It is the responsibility of each class to ensure at the conclusion of class that all the windows are latched as well as lights and fans are switched off.
13. When moving through the school for art classes, library periods, laboratory practicals, computer class, cultural programmes, etc. students are to move quietly in disciplined manner.
14. Strict silence and great reverence are expected from the students during assembly, prayer time and while singing hymns. A very serious view will be taken if any misbehavior is found at those moments.

15. Students coming from recognized schools are required to bring a school leaving certificate (TC) from the last school they attended and the mark sheet of the Annual Examination.
16. After an absence from class, students must bring the reason for the absence duly entered in the Diary. An authentic medical certificate should support absence from school on medical grounds.
17. Parents and guardians are requested to affix their specimen signature in the space indicated in the school Diary. No other signature will be accepted on the Regularity Record, Report Card, etc.
18. A school leaving certificate will not be issued without a written application from the parent/guardian of the pupil.
19. If any student wants to take T.C. then it should be informed through a letter to the principal in the last month of the academic year or before the beginning of the new session. Otherwise, he/she will have to pay the 1st Qtly. fee for getting T. C.

EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION

1. Promotion depends on the child's performance throughout the year and not only on marks secured in the final examination.
2. Promotion is decided at the teachers' meeting. Hence results are final and cannot be reconsidered. Promotion Examination's answer scripts shall not be shown.
3. Students who fail in the promotion examination may be asked to leave the school as being either unwilling or unable to study. In no case, however, will a student be allowed to repeat the same class for the third time.

4. No student will be allowed to appear for the promotion examination if the attendance during the year is below 75%.
5. Absence from examination without sufficient reason is a breach of discipline and will be considered tantamount to failure.
6. No examination will be taken before or after the proposed dates under any circumstances.
7. Progress reports are published regularly. Tampering with entries will be severely dealt with. The decision of the school authorities in the matter of promotion is final.
8. Any one found using unfair means in the examination will be debarred from further examinations and will be declared to have failed.
9. A student who fails in two major subjects is considered to have failed.

NOTES TO THE PARENTS

- Parents and guardians are earnestly requested to cooperate with the school authorities regarding rules, regulations, home work, co-curricular activities and character training of their children.
- Parents are requested to meet the principal to discuss the progress of their children by prior appointment.
- Parents are not allowed to see their children or meet teachers during the school hours.
- The school will not accept books, Tiffin, pencil box, etc. from Parents/Guardians for their children during school hours.
- Parents are requested to inculcate in their children regularity and punctuality.
- Parents shall provide sufficient number of uniforms and send their wards to school neat and tidy.
- The regularity record section shall be checked by parents as often as possible. They should mind the neatness and cleanliness of their wards and check their note books and personal appearance.
- Parents should not consult or interact with teachers without prior permission of the principal.
- Any communication (Request, complaint, etc.) should be written with full name and address of the parent/guardian and it should be addressed to the Principal only. As the Board of Trustees of the Trust are the head of this institution, the decision of the Board will be final.

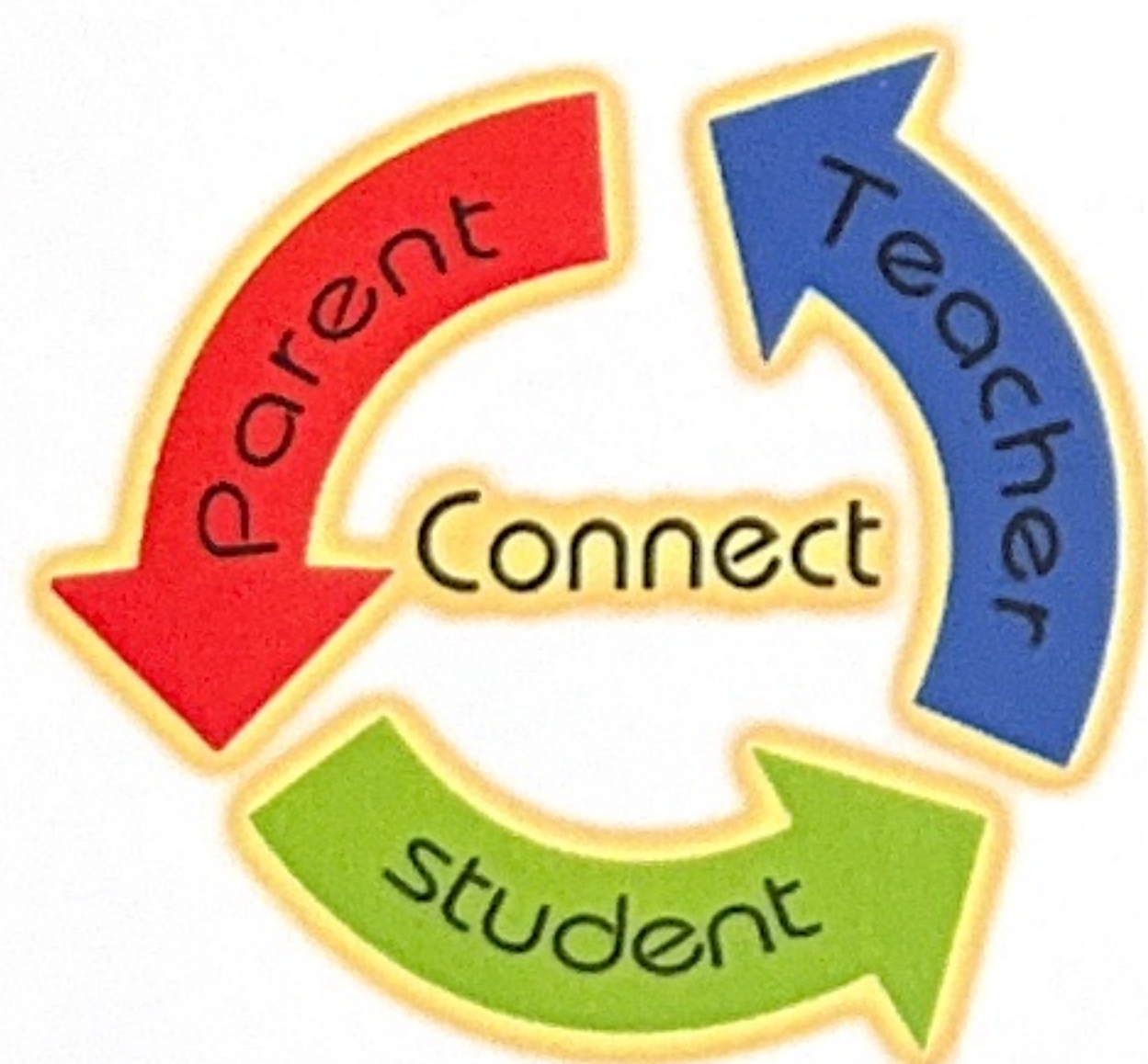

RELATIONSHIP
